



Aging in Puerto Rico, 1950-2025











 - Females 82.8




Births in Puerto Rico are Declining

Health Status, By Age Group, Puerto Rico, 2011






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Disability, by Age Group, Puerto Rico, 2011

PREHCO Findings, 2003

- 16.5% of adults 60+ report being victims of some form of abuse or maltreatment
- Challenge of stigma, being and older adult


Challenges Identified
