






Hospitals are regulated by a multitude of state and federal agencies.

What's not covered by Part A & Part B?

Medicare doesn't cover everything. If you need certain services that Medicare doesn't cover, you'll have to pay for them yourself unless you have other insurance or you're in a Medicare health plan that covers these services.

Even if Medicare covers a service or item, you generally have to pay your deductible, coinsurance, and copayments.

Some of the items and services that Medicare doesn't cover include:

Long-term care (also called custodial care)

Routine dental or eye care

Dentures

Cosmetic surgery

Acupuncture

Hearing aids and exams for fitting them

Routine foot care

Find out if Medicare covers a test, item, or service you need.

The Nursing Home Checklist

Use the Nursing Home Checklist when you visit a nursing home.

Take a copy of the Nursing Home Checklist when you visit to ask questions about resident life, nursing home living spaces, staff, residents' rooms, hallways, stairs, lounges, bathrooms, menus and food, activities, safety, and care.
