This position involved overseeing federal agency implementation of the administration's health care priorities, with a particular focus on behavioral health. Mr. Hall also served on the professional staff on the U.S. Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions, where he developed legislation on insurance regulation, health information privacy, and Medicare provider reimbursement.

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
