



To attract eligible young adults, teach them the skills they need to become employable and independent, and place them in meaningful jobs or further education.






History of Job Corps

- Job Corps was created in 1964
- Job Corps was a part of President Johnson's War on Poverty and Great Society initiatives that expanded economic and social opportunities for many people







Ramey Job Corps Center:

- Residential Program
- Located in the Old Ramey Base in Aguadilla,
 P.R.
- Serve constantly 470 students from Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands.
- Recruitment Offices located in Aguadilla,
 Arecibo, San Juan, St. Thomas, & St. Croix
- Key Partner of the EPA-led Healthy Buildings Long-Term Recovery Initiatives.

Who is Eligible?

- Age requirement of 16-24 years old
- The upper age limit is waived for a person with disabilities
- Income requirements
- U.S. citizen, U.S. national, legal/permanent resident or other lawfully admitted immigrant
- Signed consent from a parent or guardian if under 18 years old
- No pending or outstanding legal issues
- · No unpaid court-imposed financial obligations
 - Any fines, community service, or classes must be completed or paid.








What can Job Corps offer me?

- Career Technical Training (CTT)
- Work-based learning experience
- Driver's license (cat. 3, 4, 8, 9)
- Placement assistance:
 - Apprenticeships opportunities
 - College/Military preparation
 - Advanced training opportunities
- Student allowance/Transition pay
- · Basic health & dental services

Documents You Need to Apply

- · Birth Certificate or valid US Passport
- Social Security Card
- Proof of legal residence (i.e.: 1-94, Green Card, Citizenship Papers, etc.)
- Proof of income such as pay stubs, cash assistance, free or reduced school lunch
- · Immunization (shot) records
- · High School transcript or copy of HSD/HSE
- · Health insurance card

All documents are required







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
