Why it matters: Earlier this month, the Chamber helped drive consensus among industry stakeholders and environmental groups in support of a <u>deal to phase out</u> <u>hydrofluorocarbons</u> (HFCs) nationwide over the next 15 years. Simultaneously, the Chamber led a diverse coalition of think tanks, environmental and industry organizations urging Congress to enact bipartisan legislation to <u>increase federal R&D</u> and facilitate demonstration and commercialization of these critical technologies.

Looking ahead: Before the week's end, the House has the opportunity to pass significant climate and energy innovation legislation. The Senate also has an opportunity to take up its much-anticipated innovation package before the end of year.

Bottom line: Inaction is not an option, and we should move forward with sensible solutions that get results.
