Transportation Secretary Elaine Chao, gave a keynote emphasizing that the Department of Transportation is leading and supporting a range of anti-human trafficking efforts at the state, local, federal, and international levels.

What she said: “We have over 500 pledges signed by transportation leaders, labor, and nongovernmental organizations. The signatories have committed to train over 1.3 million employees to help fight human trafficking.”
