Businesses Respond to Natural Disasters in California and the Gulf Coast

This week, mother nature has wreaked havoc on communities and businesses across the country. Hurricane Laura made landfall last night near the Texas-Louisiana border bringing 20-foot storm surge and 130 mile-per-hour winds. At the same time, there are wildfires raging in California, burning thousands of acres and destroying hundreds of buildings.
