

Chamber's Donohue and Brilliant Chat with IMF's Managing Director on Economic Recovery

Today, U.S. Chamber CEO Tom Donohue, U.S. Chamber Executive Vice President and Head of International Affairs Myron Brilliant, and IMF Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva discussed pathways to resilient economic models that address a greener recovery, climate change, job creation and a more equitable society.

At the [From Great Lock Down to Great Transformation](#) event, Donohue noted that international cooperation and strong global alliances are needed to find a vaccine, to keep supply chains secure and stable, and to allow for movement of goods. These are necessary for economic recovery. Those who believe now is a time to turn inward are “just plain wrong,” he added.

In conversation, Brilliant asked Georgieva about naysayers towards multilateral institutions and the need for them for economic recovery. “A clear lesson from the pandemic is that countries cannot do it alone,” said Georgieva. “We have to beat COVID everywhere to be safe at home. Better to beat it working together. Collaboration is a source of strength, and it's a source of strength for businesses, communities, and individuals.”
