

Take Action: Help Stop the PRO Act



Help the Chamber stand against the anti-worker, [Protect the Right to Organize \(PRO\) Act](#).

Labor unions are planning a day of action on Thursday to push a bill that would impose dangerous changes to labor law. We need to make sure that Senators hear from the much larger and louder coalition of people who oppose this legislation.

Why it matters: The PRO Act, which passed the House last month, is **PRO union, not PRO worker**. It will **harm employees, threaten job creation, and undermine our economic recovery**.

How? This wish list of union-sponsored priorities would:

- Effectively overturn right-to-work laws in 27 states
- Allow the firing of workers who opt out of paying unwanted union dues
- Strip independent contractors of flexible work arrangements and kill earning opportunities
- Abolish secret ballots and threaten worker privacy in favor of “card check” voting, where union organizers demand that individual workers publicly sign a card in favor of the union.

Our take: “The [PRO Act would threaten](#) worker privacy, force employees to pay union dues or lose their jobs and trample free speech rights. The Chamber will fight to ensure this wish list of union-sponsored priorities fails in the Senate and never becomes law,” said Chamber President and CEO Suzanne Clark.
